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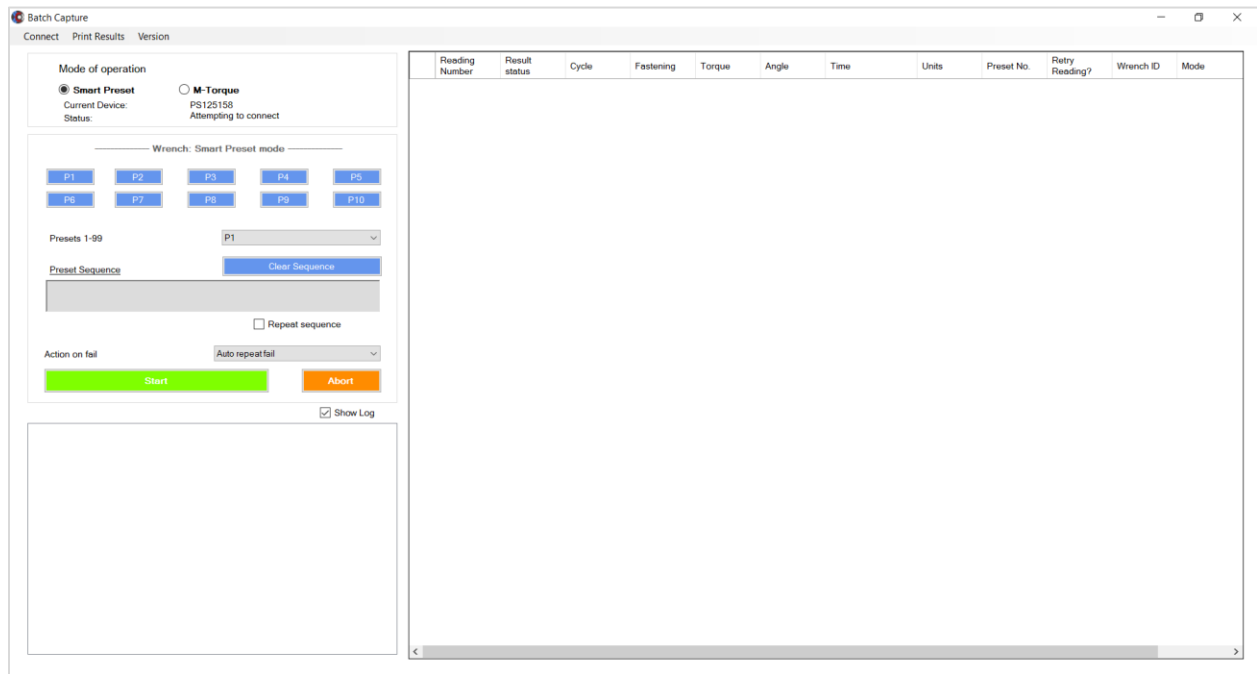
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1 Batch Capture Installation

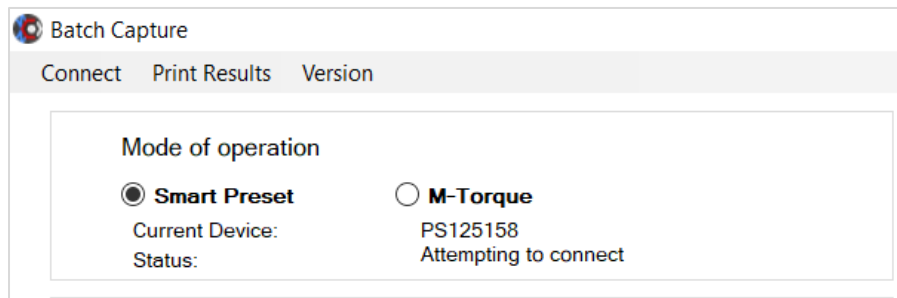
1. To install batch capture, run “BatchCaptureInstaller.exe” and follow the on screen Instructions.
2. “BatchCaptureInstaller.exe” is configured to automatically install all necessary dependencies. This may take a few minutes.
3. Once the installation is complete, a desktop icon will appear on the desktop.

Note: If an error occurs during install, check for older versions of “batch capture” or “WheelTorque” in “add or remove programs” under PC system settings and uninstall them.

2 Batch Capture User Interface explained



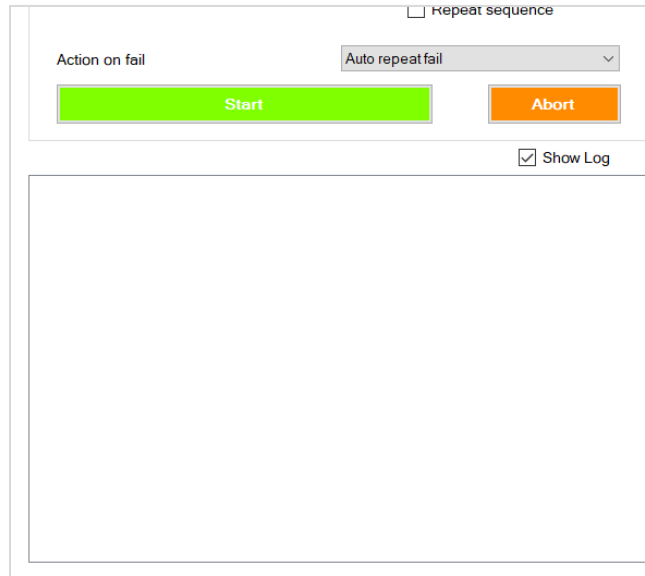
2.1 Menu bar



1. **Connect:** Allows users to connect to new or existing tool.
2. **Print Results**
 - i. **Print:** All results in the results table are printed.
 - ii. **Print setup:** Set the print layout and printer to use.
 - iii. **Save to File:** Save results table to a .csv file.
3. **Version:** Shows the current installed version of the batch capture.
4. **Smart Preset:** In this mode the supervisor can select a sequence of presets or queue a batch of up to 10 Presets, the torque information is taken from the associated preset that is configured on the tool.
5. **M-Torque:** In this mode the supervisor sends all the fastening information to the tool.

6. **Current device:** The current/most recently connected tool's name is displayed here.
7. **Status:** If the current device is sending and receiving Bluetooth transmissions.

2.2 Tool Status

1. **Show log:** Show/hide the status message and the communication exchange between batch capture and the tool.

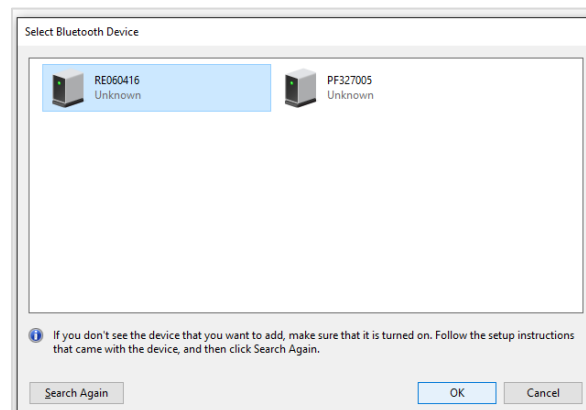

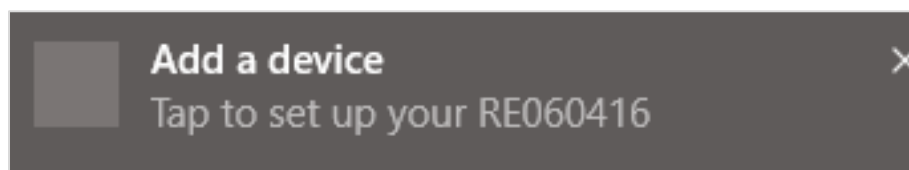
3 Common functionality

3.1 Connecting to a device

1. Open Batch Capture.
2. Ensure Bluetooth is available and active on the host computer.
3. Select “Connect” from the top left corner of the screen.
4. If Bluetooth is enabled on user’s computer, the tool will be discovered within 60 seconds.
5. From the wrench menu select either “Smart preset” or “M-Torque” mode. The Bluetooth identification number of the tool should appear in the Bluetooth device window. Select the tool ID.
6. Click on the “OK” button.



7. Click on the “Add a device” pop-up.




8. If prompted for a password enter “1234”.

Note: A torque tool can only establish a Bluetooth connection to one computer at a time.

3.2 M-Torque – Single job

1. **Job name:** A name of the job, this will be displayed on the OLED of the tool.
2. **Number of Fastenings:** The number of fastenings for the current job.
3. **Acceptable Low:** The lowest acceptable torque for the current job.

4. **Target Torque:** The optimal or target torque for the job.
5. **Acceptable High:** The highest acceptable torque for the current job.
6. **Delete Parameter:** Delete a saved set of parameters.
7. **Save Parameter:** Save a set of parameters under the name entered in “Job Name” field.
8. **Start:** Send the job configuration to the wrench as defined in the above fields. Note tool must be in m-torque mode.
9. **Abort:** Abort the current tightening that is in progress.

1. **Preset Data:** Ensure the tool is configured with the correct preset data before using the smart preset software.
2. **Preset sequence:** This input box will contain a list of color-coded presets in the format of PX where X is the tool preset number, P1 = Preset 1.
 - RED – Failed tightening
 - Green – passed tightening
 - Yellow – Current tightening
 - Grey/not coloured – Tightening has not yet been sent to device.
3. **Clear sequence:** This will clear the presets listed in the preset sequence input box.
4. **Repeat sequence:** Automatically restart the sequence once all presets in the queue have been completed.
5. **Abort:** Cancel the current job/queue.

6. Action on fail:

- i. **Supervisor control:** The batch capture user must use the on-screen prompt to decide if the tool operator should repeat a failed result or move to next tightening.
 - ii. **Auto repeat fail:** In this mode the tool will automatically repeat any failed preset, until a successful torque application is received.
 - iii. **Repeat sequence:** Proceed to the next preset in the queue if a failed result occurs.
7. **P1, P2 etc. buttons:** “P” represents preset and the number represents the tool’s preset number. Select from the drop down to select a preset number higher than preset 10. Preset information must be configured on the wrench for Smart Preset to function correctly.

3.4 Sequencing a job

1. Connect to the appropriate tool.
2. Select the order of the presets required from the blue buttons labelled “P” and the dropdown if preset numbers higher then preset 10 is required.

3. If the sequence needs to be repeated use the checkbox “Repeat sequence”. See “**Action on fail**” for explanation of the options available when a fail is detected.
4. Press the green start button once the correct sequence has been created.

Note: If the preset sequence is edited after start press, the queue indicator while no longer function correctly, however the sequence will still execute.

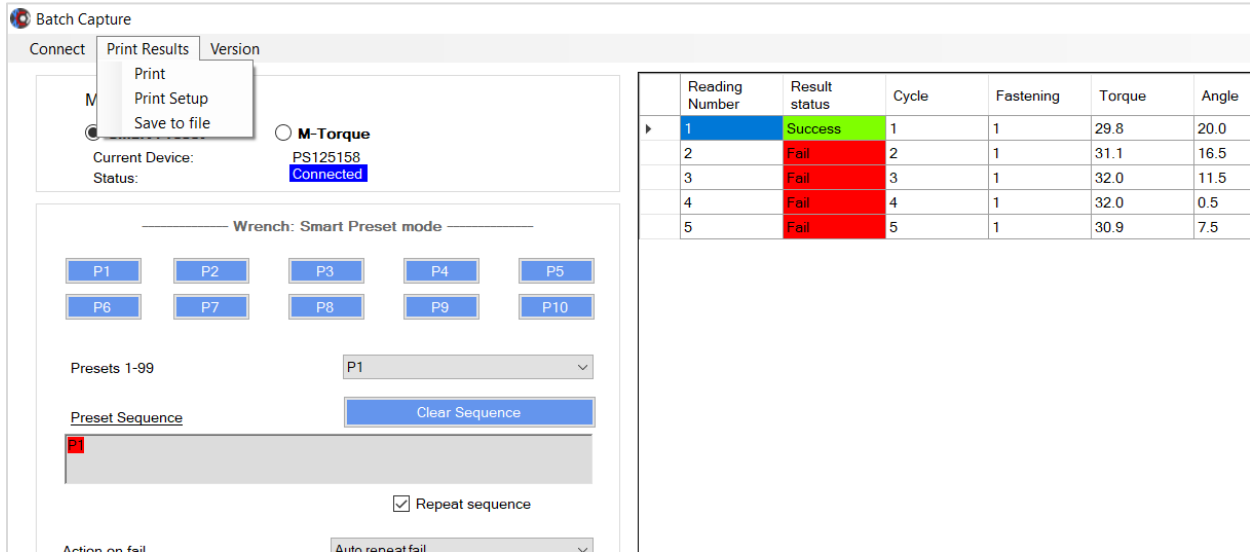

To save the results displayed from batch capture, select print results and from the dropdown menu select “Save to File”.

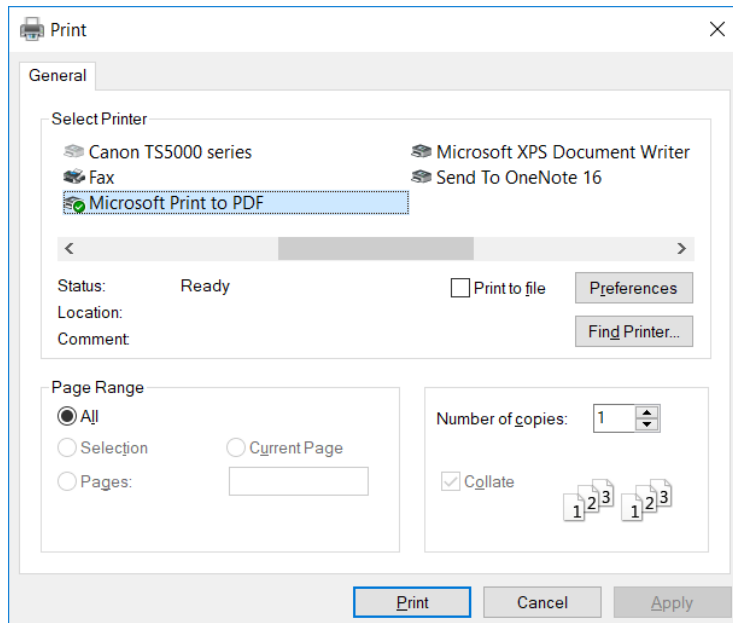

3.5.1 Printing

Selecting print allows the user to print all results from the batch capture results table.

3.5.2 Save to file

Results can be output to a .csv file via the save to file button. .csv files can be used by most data manipulation tools such as excel.
